

1. What is the Public File?

Each local commercial radio station in the UK has requirements in respect of its music and local content, such as news etc. These requirements are set out in the station "Format", a document issued by Ofcom, the UK media regulator.

The Public File contains details of elements Ofcom regulate over, such as music tracks, local news etc. It is intended to give you a better understanding of our output and what we are doing for the community we serve.

The Public File is available as a print out on request. Any comments on the file can be made to us or Ofcom.

Below are details of how often we broadcast news bulletins and whether they are local, national or international news.

6. Automation and Local Programming

Sometimes it is necessary to pre-record (sometimes called Automation) programmes on the station. Currently we only automate during off peak programming. All our programmes are broadcast from Sunderland studies apart from the 'Big Top 40 Show' Sundays 4pm-7pm.

7. Events and Charities we support

We support various local charity events every year. This usually includes promoting events on the radio station, attending events and donating prizes to worthwhile causes such as raffles. Over the years we have dedicated a whole days broadcasting and fundraising for our 'Bring A Pound to Work Day'. Hundreds of local businesses register their staff to 'Bring a Pound to Work' which we collected as a station in the community.

So far we have raised almost £300,000.

Over the last few years, members of staff have not only raised awareness of various charity events, they have also participated in many of them. For example, The Sunderland 10k, the worlds largest half marathon -The Great North Run, The Race For Life, abseiling down the football stadium, sponsored head shaves, male body waxing, and betting for charity on the Breakfast Show.

8. Coverage Highlights

The Sunderland International Airshow

Every year we take the radio station to the seafront for a 3-day outside broadcast from Europe's largest free airshow. Over a million people assemble on the beach and surrounding areas to watch the free airshow and be entertained by their local radio station. During this weekend all local daytime programming is broadcast live from the event.

The Summer & Christmas Tours

Twice a year we take the lunchtime show out and around Wearside, with an opportunity to win prizes, cash and of course a fantastic holiday.

Summer Concerts

We broadcast live from the various concerts held at the Stadium of Light across the Summer season, as well as giving listeners the opportunity to win tickets.
